45. Environmental Consciousness and Sustainability/Alternate Energy initiatives taken by the institution :

- Sustainable landscaping was done by introducing vertical gardening in 2019-20 by which the
 college utilises it premises at its maximum capacity with aesthetic valences.
- College authority has introduced eco-accommodating 10KW inverters as elective force backup
 instead of fuel-based generators utilized prior. Energy-saving LED and CFL lights have been
 introduced in each spot of the college premises in substitution of tube lights utilized before.
- 3. Solar panels of 50KW were installed and the power produced is communicated to the public lattice. This has cut down the power bill of the college generously.
- 4. Proper segregation of chemical and biological waste from different practical based departments was done in specific isolated bins. Prompt disposal of biological waste in areas specified by corporations are made.
- 5. Waste containers were set at strategic points in the college sites to check littering. Furthermore, separate waste canisters were reserved for biodegradable and non biodegradable waste materials.
