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Influence of Indian Philosophical Thought on the Philosophy of Mircea Eliade

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Speakers: Prof. Ashish Kumar Sana, Department of Commerce, University of Calcutta

The SC/ST Cell of New Alipore College organized a seminar on Legal Awareness on 12th September 2022. The seminar aimed to raise awareness about the legal rights of individuals, especially those from marginalized communities. The seminar was attended by students and faculty members of the college. The seminar was conducted in two sessions. The first session was conducted by Mr. Abhishek Verma, Advocate, High Court, who spoke about the legal rights of SC/ST individuals in India. He emphasized the importance of knowing one's rights and how to exercise them. Mr. Verma also talked about the various laws and provisions that have been put in place to protect the rights of SC/ST individuals. He spoke about the Prevention of Atrocities Act, 1989, which provides for stringent punishment for offenses against SC/ST individuals. He also talked about

the importance of filing FIRs and seeking legal help in case of any violations of rights.

The second session was conducted by Ms. Ekta Hela, Professor at Jogesh Chandra Choudhury College. She spoke about the legal provisions related to women's rights in India. Ms. Hela talked about the various laws and provisions that have been put in place to protect women's rights. She spoke about the Protection of Women from Domestic Violence Act, 2005, which provides for the protection of women from domestic violence. She also talked about the Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace (Prevention, Prohibition and Redressal) Act, 2013, which provides for the prevention and redressal of sexual harassment of women at the workplace.

The sessions were followed by a Q&A session where the students and faculty members asked various questions related to the legal rights of SC/ST individuals and women. The speakers answered the questions and cleared any doubts that the participants had. Issues related to marginalized communities.

prevention of sexual harassment

Speakers: Prof. Ashish Kumar Sana, Department of Commerce, University of Calcutta

The Women's Cell of New Alipore College recently organized a workshop on the prevention of sexual harassment. The workshop was aimed at creating awareness about the importance of preventing sexual harassment and how to address and prevent such incidents. The workshop was attended by a diverse group of students, faculty, and staff.

The workshop included talks delivered by Prof. Nibabari Banerjee and social worker Ranjita Singha. Prof. Banerjee highlighted the importance of understanding the concept of consent and how it plays a significant role in preventing sexual harassment. He also discussed the various laws and policies in place to prevent sexual harassment in educational institutions and workplaces. Prof. Banerjee also spoke about the need to address the issue of sexual harassment towards the third gender.

Ranjita Singha, the social worker, shared her experiences of working with survivors of sexual harassment and emphasized the importance of providing support to victims. She stressed the need for creating safe spaces where victims can speak out and seek help without fear of judgment or retaliation.

The workshop emphasized the following key points: Consent is essential: The concept of consent was emphasized as a crucial factor in preventing sexual harassment. It was highlighted that any sexual act without consent is a form of sexual harassment.

Third Gender: The speakers emphasized the need to address sexual harassment towards the third gender. It was highlighted that the laws and policies in place must be inclusive and considerate of the needs of the third gender.

On this day, Mihaela Gligor, head of the Department of Indian Studies, University of Cluj, Romania, gave a speech on the topic of 'Influence of Indian Philosophical Thought on the Philosophy of Mircea Eliade'. From Rabin-dranath, Mircea Eliade to Maitreyi Devi—everything came up in his speech.

Mircha, a resident of Romania, came to India and studied darshan with Maitreyi Devi's father. Lived in their house. Mircha wanted to learn Indian language and culture from Maitreyi. Maitreyi also wanted to learn foreign languages from Mircha. Although their friendship reached love, it did not end. Later Mircha returned to the country and wrote a novel about this experience. Maitreyi Devi also wrote the novel called 'Na Hanyate'. The death of Mirchar in 1986 and Maitreyi Devi in 1990 remained

Mihela said that most of the people of her country understand Mircha-Maitreyi when they say India. Therefore, while discussing Mircha's philosophy, the subject of Maitreyi Devi also comes up on this day.
