## **Detailed Report on Educational Excursion to Bolpur Shantiniketan**



### **Introduction:**



Title: Report on the Activities of the Academic Session 2019-2020: The Influence of Indian Philosophical Thoughts on Mircea Eliade's Philosophy

### **Introduction:**

### **Presentations:**


