Report of the Programme

Introduction:

Raja Ram Mohan Roy (1772-1833) was a social reformer and identified as India's greatest feminist, He was at the forefront to liberate women against social injustices such as female infanticide, child marriage, polygamy, purdah, and sati. He was the founder of the Indian Renaissance Movement and his efforts led to the banning of the "Sati Pratha", the granting of inheritance rights to women, and the promotion of women's education as being equally essential to that of males. Also, he was a freedom warrior, the creator of the Indian language press and the founder of the Brahmo Samaj, and a reporter for the Jana Jagaran. Recognizing his social contributions, the British Government bestowed him with the title "The Father of the Bengal Renaissance". Likewise, King Akbar Shah II, the Mughal Emperor of Delhi, awarded him with the title "Raja" and Nobel laureate, Rabindranath Tagore referred to Raja Ram Mohan Roy as "Bharat Pathik". Raja Ram Mohan Roy's contributions to social reform of women, their education, and empowerment are still very relevant today and also are the founding aspirations of the Indian Constitution. Against this backdrop and to commemorate the 250th birth anniversary of Raja Ram Mohan Roy in Women Empowerment and Transformation in New India is being organized by Ananya Institute for Development Research and Social Action, Lucknow Uttar Pradesh, in collaboration with New Alipore College, Kolkata under the auspices of Ministry of Culture, Government of India, New Delhi to discuss and deliberate upon the pertinent issues, dimensions and aspects of women empowerment and transformation in India in the context of commemoration of Raja Ram Mohan Roy.

Objectives of Workshop:

- > To highlight the concept of social reforms of Raja Ram Mohan Roy and its impact on modern India
- ➤ To examine the role and contribution of Raja Ram Mohan Roy in the eradication of women-related social unjust and the resultant women's development and transformation.

Inaugural Speech:

Sri Debasish Kumar, Honorable MLA, inaugurated the workshop. He talked about the significance of Raja Ram Mohan Roy in interpreting religion through scientific intervention for the first time in colonial India. He highlighted Raja Ram Mohan Roy's visionary ideas, which aimed to bring about a progressive shift in the Indian society of that time. He emphasized that Raja Ram Mohan Roy was a staunch advocate of women's rights and actively worked towards dismantling social norms and practices that restricted their empowerment. Sri Debasish Kumar emphasized that Raja Ram Mohan Roy's efforts were crucial in challenging the prevailing customs that oppressed women and impeded their progress. A key aspect of Raja Ram Mohan Roy's work, as highlighted in the speech, was his approach to interpreting religion through scientific intervention. He recognized that religion, while an integral part of Indian society, was often misinterpreted and used as a tool to perpetuate discrimination and subjugation. To counter this, Raja Ram Mohan Roy employed scientific reasoning and logic to challenge regressive religious practices that hindered women's rights. Sri Kumar stressed that Raja Ram Mohan Roy's tireless efforts in religious reform played a pivotal role in shaping the discourse around gender equality. By emphasizing the inherent equality of all individuals, irrespective of gender, Raja Ram Mohan Roy laid the foundation for women's empowerment in India. He worked towards eradicating practices such as Sati (the burning of widows), child marriage, and the purdah system, which marginalized and subjugated women.

Speech of the Chief guests: Prof. Ajay Pratap Singh

Chief Guest, Prof. Ajay Pratap Singh, Director General, Raja Ram Mohan Roy Library Foundation delivered his thought-provoking talk on the role of Raja Ram Mohan Roy in Indian Renaissance. He outlined the historical context of Raja Ram Mohan Roy's era, highlighting the prevailing social, cultural, and religious conditions in colonial India. Prof. Singh emphasized that Raja Ram Mohan Roy was a visionary thinker who challenged traditional norms and fought against social evils, especially those perpetuated by orthodox religious practices. Prof. Singh further discussed Raja Ram Mohan Roy's efforts in promoting social reforms, with a specific focus on the abolition of Sati, the practice of widow burning. He shed light on the relentless campaign led by Raja Ram Mohan Roy to ban this inhumane practice, which ultimately resulted in the passage of the Bengal Sati Regulation Act in 1829. The chief guest praised Raja Ram Mohan Roy's determination and courage in the face of staunch opposition from conservative elements of society. Furthermore, Prof. Singh highlighted Raja Ram Mohan Roy's significant contributions to the education system in India. He spoke about the establishment of the Hindu College in Calcutta (now Kolkata) and its transformation into Presidency College, which laid the foundation for modern education in the country. The speaker also touched upon Raja Ram Mohan Roy's support for women's education and his efforts to promote the study of English and vernacular languages.

Guest Speaker: Dr. A.K. Singh - Urban Transformation in India




