ADMISSION PROCEDURE

The process of admission to 1st year classes starts every year shortly after the publication of the results of 10+2 Level of West Bengal Council of Higher Secondary Education.Online Applications are invited through college website www.newaliporecollege.in. Minimum Eligibility Criteria for different courses are as per norms of the University of Calcutta. List of subject combinationsoffered by the college and Admission Fees are available on the college website.

Admission is granted strictly on the basis of the Merit List published by the College. Selected candidates are intimated via email or sms to the registered Mobile Number. Candidates have to pay requisite Admission Fees through online portal. Candidates need not contact anybody before taking admission.

Documents uploaded at the time of Online Application are verified after commencement of 1st year Classes.

If any document is found to be false or irrelevant, the admission will stand cancelled and no fees will be refunded.

Following Documents are needed at the time of document verification.

- □ Original Mark-sheet of 10+2 Level
- □ Original Admit Card of 10+2 Level
- Original Age Proof (10th Admit Card any equivalent)
- □ If a candidate is applying for reservation e.g., SC/ST/OBC-A/B categories, original certificate issued by Govt. of West Bengal in the name of the candidate will only be considered.
- □ For players quota, the original certificate* of the particular sport has to be provided.(*only Zonal, District, State, National Level certificate will be considered)
- □ For BPL candidates, the BPL card is mandatory.
- □ For Differently Abled candidates, original certificate is mandatory.

It has rich collection of valuable Books, both text and reference, Journals, Magazines and Daily News Papers for both lending and reference purposes. A special collection on Dalit Studies was also there for interested user. The students are provided with barcoded library membership cards and issue return of the library books is automated done through Integrated Library Management Software KOHA. All the students and staff members have access to every resource and service provided by the library against library membership card. The library is fully automated and online catalogue can be accessed remotely.





Note :- However such travel concession card not be issued during vacation.

STUDENT AID FUND

A student can apply for aid on submission of the following documents :-

✓ Attendance record showing a minimum of 60% attendance till the date of submission of concession application.

✓ Academic performance record showing at least 45% marks in all previous examinations appeared at.

Note :- Aid cannot be claimed as a right, but will be determined by the college strictly on the merit of the application.

SCHOLARSHIP AND GOVERNMENT FINANCIAL SUPPORT

Students' Credit Card scheme

A student credit card is one such variant that is tailor-made to suit the needs of college students. This scheme allows students to manage their educational expenses in an easy manner. Under the superior guidance of Dr. Jaydeep Sarangi (HOI), Student Credit Card Scheme has been launched on 1st of July,2021 in our college to promote the financial growth of our college students.

Student credit cards: features and benefits

- With this credit card, any Indian student staying in Bengal, who studies in Class X and above to graduation, PG, PhD and post-doctoral level can apply for loans at a low interest rate to pursue higher studies in India or abroad. The loan has to be paid back within 15 years.
- Students can take admission in coaching centres as well for competitive examinations by using the credit card.
- Students can take admission in foreign universities by using this card and pursue the courses of their choice up to PhD or post-doctoral level.
- The students can get Rs 10 lakh loan at one go or in phases as per their need and no guarantor will be needed for that because, the state government will stand as guarantee.
- Students can get the loan to prepare for competitive exams, for pursuing diploma courses and even for professional courses like MBBS.
- The nationalized banks and cooperative banks will provide the loan without any collateral security. The interest rate will be 4% and if paid during the study period, there will be a further rebate of 1%.
- Students can pay the course fee, tuition fee, examination fee through this card and it will be directly credited to the institutes. Up to 30% of the total sanctioned amount can be used for non-institutional purposes like purchasing books, computers and for study tours. However, the students need to be cautious so that no fraud happens with the Student Credit Card.
- The scheme covers education from Madhyamik level to professional courses including doctorate and post-doctorate research work in any recognized educational institute within or outside India.

• The education loan will cover various institutional and non-institutional expenses.

Minority Scholarship

Eligible students avail minority scholarship notified by the honourable Government. Students have to apply online and come to the college office with printed copy of their online application along with the supporting documents as specified by the Government. After that, college verifies and approves the documents provided by the students so that the students get aid from the government.

Kanyashree

Kanyashree registration is notified by the college and students have to transfer their name from their previous school and to contact college office collect the Kanyashree Form. Forms need to be filled up and a certificate claiming that the candidate is unmarried has to be produced. After verification, college approves the applications.

Once approved, the govt notifies for physical verification and the students need to go the Kanyashree Office at Social Sector Bhawan, CGO office for that. After physical verification, studentsget the aid from the Government directly.

Swami Vivekananda Scholarship

Registration for the Swami Vivekananda Scholarship is notified by the Government. The student have to apply online and submit the printed copy of the form with supporting document as specified by the state govt. The form is verified by the college and handed over to the students for uploading online. After uploading from the students' end, college approves them and they get aid from Government directly.

SC/ST/OBC Scholarships

Students have to apply online on the government website as per notification and submit printed copy of their



application to college office. The College verifies the application and returns to the students it to submit to the corresponding office of the government after which they get the scholarship directly from the govt.

Psychological Counselling Cell

Mental health is an important and often neglected issue. To ensure that our students are happy and stress Free, the College has a psychological cell which organizes seminar sand workshops on mental health and well being. Students facing any problems regarding studies or personal matters are free to approach the counsellors for help and guidance.







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RULES AND REGULATIONS
