Report of the Special Lecture on 'Media's Depiction of Corona Virus Issues: Case Studies'

Report of the Webinar on "Śamkara's Concept of Brahma or Ātmā"

Objectives of the Webinar:

- 1. To provide an in-depth understanding of the philosophy of Advaita Vedanta as propounded by Śamkara.
- 2. To explain the concept of Brahma or Ātmā as the ultimate reality according to Śamkara's teachings.
- 3. To explore the relationship between the individual self (jiva) and the supreme self (Brahman) in Advaita Vedanta.
- 4. To highlight the relevance of Śamkara's teachings in contemporary times and their practical applications in daily life.

Description of the Webinar:

On December 20th, 2021, the Department of Philosophy and Sanskrit, New Alipore College and Hiralal Mazumdar Memorial College for Women organized a webinar on "Śamkara's Concept of Brahma or Ātmā". Professor Tulika Paul from the Department of Sanskrit, New Alipore College as the speaker.

During the webinar, Prof. Tulika Paul discussed the Advaita Vedanta philosophy of Śamkara and how he conceptualized Brahma or Ātmā. She explained that according to Śamkara, the ultimate reality is Brahman, which is pure consciousness, and that the self (ātman) is identical to Brahman. She also discussed the importance of realizing this identity through the process of self-inquiry (ātma-vichāra).

After the presentation, there was a question and answer session where attendees asked various questions related to the topic. Prof. Paul provided insightful answers, clarifying many of the complex concepts discussed in the presentation. Overall, the webinar provided a deep understanding of Śamkara's philosophy and his concept of Brahma or Ātmā.

Outcomes of the Webinar:

- 1. It is described as pure consciousness, the source of all knowledge.
- 2. Our experience of the world is illusory, based on false identification with the body, mind, and ego.
- 3. Spiritual disciplines lead to realizing the self as identical with Brahma or Ātmā.
- 4. This realization leads to liberation from the cycle of birth and death, and the limitations of the material world.

Report of the Students' Seminar on "Aṣṭāṇgikamārga in Bauddha Philosophy"

Objectives of the Seminar:

Report of the Special Lectures on 'Implementing Buddhist Philosophies in Everyday Life'

Introduction:

In an effort to explore the relevance and practical applications of Buddhist philosophies in contemporary society, New Alipore College, in collaboration with Muralidhar Girls' College, organized a series of special lectures titled "Implementing Buddhist Philosophies in Everyday Life".

This program took place on May 2nd, 2022, at the premises of New Alipore College. The event aimed to delve into the profound teachings of Buddhism and how they can be integrated into our daily lives for personal growth, ethical living, and overall well-being.

Activities and Sessions:

The program consisted of a series of enlightening sessions conducted by esteemed resource persons from various academic disciplines. 

On June 22nd, 2022, the Department of Philosophy, New Alipore College and P. N. Das College jointly organized an Extension lecture on the topic of "Social Change: Marxist view and Gandhian view". The event was held at New Alipore College and was well attended by students and faculty members from both institutions.

The keynote speaker for the event was Prof. Dipa Chakraborty, an Associate Professor in the Department of Philosophy, P. N. Das College.
